SAFE HANDLING OF UNFAMILIAR OR SUSPICIOUS FIREARMS

Firearms can be manufactured through a variety of methods. Some of these methods are unregulated and do not meet the current industry safety standards and/or State or Federal law. These firearms can be crude or unique in appearance, or replicas of well-known firearms.







The handling or manipulation of unfamiliar or "homemade" firearms is inherently dangerous.

In the performance of their duty, personnel may encounter situations where there is a need to handle or manipulate unfamiliar or suspicious firearms. These situations may include but are not limited to searches of persons or property, evidence processing, x-ray screening, property safekeeping/destruction, safety sweeps, crime scene integrity, etc.

In non-exigent situations, notify your supervisor to contact the Department Commander. The Department Commander may then request that the OCSD Tactical Support Element (TSE) respond to
